

What a beautiful, God filled weekend we had!



Plant Daffodils



If you want to understand the ways of the Lord, plant daffodils.

Early in spring, there's just a plain field or a plain patch of dirt. But leave for a weeklong trip, and when you return, you may find a field of yellow! Where there had been nothing, now gorgeous stems stand proud and graceful, bursts of life from barren ground. Amazing! We made a trip a couple of weeks ago to Ms. Lees Daffodil Garden. There weren't precious little sprouts peeking through the soil, but stems and stems, strong and plentiful, hundreds reporting the week of warming weather. There is nothing new in this story, especially if you are a seasoned gardener, but it "springs" up two points:

First, that we can hear spring stories like this — seeds sprouting, bare trees leafing out, flower buds swelling to bloom — but when we see them, when they are our personal experience and when we personally stand in awe at their appearance, that is another matter altogether (Job 42:5). We know; we believe! Life has burst up from the sleeping soil before our very eyes and sends joy, resilience and wonder surging through our soul.

Secondly, that the garden stewards the story of spring, the resurrection story: What was dead comes back to life. The moment simply speaks to us of Jesus' resurrection, an event the returning array of daffodils imprints on us with a deeper intensity. The bare plot turned yellow beauty shows us new birth and a living hope (1 Peter 1:3 – 4), a graphic and amazing account of death to life.

The hosannas of the lilacs, can you hear them shout and sing? The greening of the grass. The leafing of the trees. How could anyone not see what's happening, how could anyone miss it? There is nothing subtle or cryptic about it. Who wouldn't be a believer, watching breathlessly in reverential awe, as unfathomable wonders, one after another, reveal themselves to us?

Over and over the spring garden proclaims the way of God's salvation (Psalm 67:1); new shoots and vibrant leaves keep us in the company of the redemption story, reminding us that God has blessed us with his salvation (Psalm 67:6).

Publications For You




I will go about my days reading His Word, being refined by His truth, transformed by His holiness, forever reminded that He holds our days in His hands.
