
<u>Saturday, April 26, Gathering</u> – <u>1st Methodist, Gladewater</u> - Potluck at Noon, Worship immediately after.

Our Personal Road to Emmaus

Three days after the death of Jesus, two of His disciples were walking along the road to the village of Emmaus, which is about seven miles from Jerusalem. They were absorbed in their own thoughts and worries, when they were joined by a stranger.

The stranger asked, "What is this conversation that you are holding with each other as you walk?" And they stood still, looking sad. The disciples spoke of the recent events "concerning Jesus of Nazareth." They believed that Jesus had come to redeem Israel, but He had been unjustly condemned and crucified. They also said that those who knew Christ best were saying He had risen from the dead. The stranger told them they were "slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken." He reviewed what the scriptures taught and how Christ had fulfilled prophecy. This filled the disciples with joy.

When they arrived at Emmaus, the disciples asked the stranger to "abide with them". At dinner the stranger blessed bread and broke it. Suddenly, the disciples recognized that the stranger was no stranger at all but the risen Savior Himself!

We may wonder why the two disciples didn't know the Savior was walking with them. And yet how often do we fail to understand that He walks with us? Often, we are so focused on the challenges, and even the joys, in our daily lives that we do not see that Jesus is by our side. We may not see how He stays with us, strives with us, works with us, and cries with us. Even in

our saddest moments, if we take notice, we can feel Him with us and hear His words:
"Be still and know that I am God".

We each have a destination to reach in this life. At times on our journey, we may face illness, or we may struggle with our own weakness. We may have money problems or the challenges that come from success, wealth, and pride.

As we travel our personal road to Emmaus, we need never walk alone. We can ask the Savior to be with us.

Draw Me Close

I lay it all down again
To hear You say that I'm Your friend
You are my desire. No one else will do

Here are simple activities that will help us draw near to Him.

- 1. Draw Near to God By Doing More
 Than Skimming Your Bible. Imagine
 you are the blind beggar along the
 road, the paralytic by the pool, the
 bleeding woman, or an onlooker in
 some Bible passage. Imagine the
 scene. Take it a step further and do
 some research on what sights, sounds,
 and smells might have been present in
 the moment. Allow yourself to actually
 walk through the story as you read.
- 2. Enter into Prayer as a two-way conversation. It's easy to run through your lists of prayer requests without stilling yourself to listen to what God wants to put on your heart. Sit in silence as much as you talk when you pray. Remain attentive to scripture that God puts on your heart.
- 3. Begin your prayer time with open arms. Be in a posture of surrender to the Lord. Give thanks with raised hands, confess with open palms, release cares with outspread arms, and receive with open hands.
- 4. *Pursue silence and solitude*. This one is hard in today's busy world. Like sitting with a trusted friend at the lake or by the ocean, simply quieting ourselves for a few minutes, all while meditating on God's love for us, is a refreshing way to encounter him.



On our own road to Emmaus, the Savior lovingly invites us to come unto Him and rejoice in Him. As we pray each day, feast on the scriptures, and invite Him to abide with us, He will be near us. We will then come to know, as the disciples on the road to Emmaus came to know, that Jesus Christ is risen and that He truly lives and loves us. He is eager to be with us and to guide us safely on our way.

Happy 4th day to everyone. See you at the gatherings! Save me a hug!

To Follow Him...


If Jesus walked the earth today would we be followers? Jesus's teaching is hard. Count the cost (Luke 14:28). To follow Him is to pick up your cross (Matthew 16:24). To follow Him is to love your enemy and pray for them (Matthew 5:44). To follow Him is to do His will despite our own plans (Matthew 6:10). You will be hated because of Him (Matthew 24:9). Jesus doesn't hesitate to remind us of the truth.

Jesus pointed out these things in love. He calls us to be like Him. That means we must discard our flesh and put on Christ. But could you stay when you must come face to face with the worst of the worst of you?

Narrow is the gate and difficult is the road that leads to life, and few find it (Matthew 7:14).
