Dear G.R.A.C.E.

"Compensatory Assets"

I heard this phrase for the first time the other day. This may seem like just a couple of big words to some, but I couldn't stop thinking about these words and all that they implied. One of the definitions for compensate is: to counterbalance, offset, make up for. Asset means, among other things: a useful and desirable thing or quality; the total resources of a person or business. Interestingly enough, this phrase came up during a discussion I was having with another member of the G.R.A.C.E. Board of Directors, about our strengths and weaknesses. What a neat way, I thought, to describe what we all bring to any working association within the Body of Christ: Compensatory Assets. In Paul's letter to the Corinthians, a whole chapter (Chapter 12) is devoted to detailing the Spiritual gifts God provides us with to do His work. (vs. 7) We are specifically told that we are given different kinds of gifts, but all are given by the same Lord. (vs. 4-6,11). How boring life would be if we were all alike.

I think I am pretty good at recognizing the "assets" that others bring to the table, probably much better than recognizing my own. If the truth were known, I am highly unorganized, and not very good at doing things in a timely manner. The member of the Board I was having this discussion with told me that this aspect of my personality really drove her crazy when she first started working with the G.R.A.C.E. Board. I have a real hard time sticking to "Robert's Rules of Order" (I mean, who is Robert, and who decided that he got to write the rules anyway?) But over time, she began to relax, and realize that there might be other ways to get things accomplished. She said something to the effect of "God gives us all compensatory assets, so that we can work together for His glory." What a beautiful summary of 1 Corinthians 12! How many times have we seen this principle in action on an Emmaus walk, a church committee, in our workplaces or homes? I see it in action every time the G.R.A.C.E. Board meets. After our last Board meeting, I was driving home, and I know I was glowing, even though no one could see. I knew at that moment that the time spent in June's Board meeting was my "Closest to Christ" for the week. I feel that way after pretty much any Emmaus function of any kind, because I have no doubt that I have been in the presence of God's people, who have as their #1 desire in life to serve God in whatever way they can with the gifts that God has given them.

I'm not sure what, exactly, my gifts are. I think that I have a good deal of enthusiasm, and some humor, and a huge portion of faith. (That one is actually listed in 1 Corinthians 12:9.) I have faith that God will bring out the best in each of us, to accomplish His will, if we turn to Him, and do all things to His honor and Glory. At the heart of it all, that is the mission of the G.R.A.C.E. Emmaus Community, and the Board of Directors.

It won't be long before the Nominating Committee will be looking for candidates for the incoming 2008 Board members. Perhaps God is calling

you to use your gifts, your "Compensatory Assets" to serve this Emmaus Community. Perhaps He is nudging you to be a Lay Director on a future walk, or just to serve on a team. I know He is currently nudging some of you to sponsor pilgrims on the Fall On the back page of this Walks. newsletter, there is contact information for the members of the Board. Please contact any one of us, or go to our website: http://www.gracemmaus.org/ if you are ready to answer His call.

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come.

When I first took my walk to Emmaus, it was the end to a long journey of searching. I knew Christ; I believed in God and knew that Jesus died for my sins. I prayed and had rededicated my life to Christ. But, until I went on my Walk to Emmaus. I don't think I had a "REAL RELATIONSHIP" with God. After my walk, I was eager to sign up to work. I sent in my "application" to work a Chrysalis Flight. I was amazed at all the hard work that went into getting a flight set up. If you have ever worked on a team, it is such a blessing! The dedication of the hours of preparation and setup is just one of the things I was impressed with. It is hard on you physically and mentally BUT the joy is just overwhelming when watching those caterpillars or pilgrims coming closer to Christ.

Over the years I have worked many Chrysalis Flights. I am not sure that I even know an exact count. I have been many positions, and even after moving to the GRACE community, continue to drive to the North East Texas community to work flights. I think even that early I hoped that GRACE would one day be able to grown and support a Chrysalis program here. For years now I have sent information for the newsletter about the Chrysalis flights so that our youth could attend.

NOW we have the opportunity to provide flights for our youth here in GRACE! We are so excited at this opportunity. That opportunity, however, does not come without a price: work and participation.. That means we need YOU. We need participants for the steering committee in order to begin making those decisions that will lead to the changing of lives. We need YOUTH to attend flights in order to have participants who can work the flights in our community once they are in action! We need Clergy who are willing and able to attend flights, as well as Spiritual Leadership for the project completely – if you want to suggest your own Clergy, please send us their name and contact information and we will get in touch with them.

To assist and guide you along as an Emmaus Sponsor, we have come up with some ideas and tips, just to make sure that you know what to do next. What is Sponsorship?

Sponsorship is when you decide to take the responsibility of physically, emotionally and spiritually caring for a particular person with the intention of them attending a Walk to Emmaus or Chrysalis Flight. You are to look after the applicant before, during and after the walk or flight. Steps in performing your task successfully are explained herein.

Who do you Sponsor?

Pray about it earnestly. A good applicant is a person who is already committed to Christ and is living in a day-to-day relationship with Him. It is also a person desiring to increase their knowledge of Him and is open to experiencing Him in new and exciting ways. Christian leaders and potential leaders are good applicants. Servants and willing church members are also good applicants.

Here are your steps to being a successful sponsor:

Spend concentrated time in prayer. Allow God to use you to sponsor the pilgrim He desires to attend the upcoming Emmaus Walk.

Continue to spend time in prayer. Once you know who you are going to sponsor. **Discuss your choice of potential pilgrim** with your Minister and other Emmaus community members in your church. This is a good idea since Pastors or Ministers might have personal information that will encourage or prevent the person from attending an Emmaus Walk. Also remember that you require their signature on the application form and they will be much more willing to sign the form if the application has been previously discussed.

Pray about a time, place and open heart for your discussion of the Emmaus movement and make an appointment to meet the potential applicant. Inform them and their family about the weekend, and the community that grows out of these Walks.

Give your prospective applicant an application form. Explain the form to them; tell them which sections they need to complete. Make sure that you have already completed the Spiritual Sponsor section and that you are using the most current form and not an outdated one. Check the date on the form. Forms are available from the community website at www.gracemmaus.org

Collect the completed application form. Make sure that everything is completed. If the section with contact details of three friends or family members is not completed, you will not have that information to collect agape letters. Please note that the deposit must be included. If there is a problem with funding, first consult your local church for assistance. Many of the churches in our Community are prepared to pay the deposit if necessary. If there is still a major funding problem, contact the registrar.

Ask the Minister or Pastor of the applicant to sign the form. This is easy if the applicant is a member of your church. If the applicant is a member of another church, you might need to provide that Minister with some information about Emmaus. Please contact the Community Spiritual Director (contact details are on the application form or web page) and get their assistance in this regard.

Send the form in to the Emmaus Registrar. Please make sure that you send it to the correct person. Their details appear on the application form. The Emmaus registrar will send you some form of notification that the form has safely arrived. Please make sure that you get this, if not contact the registrar to determine where the form is. Make sure that the deposit is included with the form. Also note that there is a closing date for forms. Make sure that your form is handed in before the closing date. It is general practice to make the application closing date about six weeks prior to the walk.

Wait prayerfully for a letter giving the walk details your pilgrim is selected for.

The Emmaus Board has a selection committee that meets to discuss and select the pilgrims for the next walk. The letter will be sent about four to eight weeks prior to the walk and will include the information supplied on the application form concerning three contact names and numbers that you should use for collecting agape letters.

Begin preparations for collecting agape letters. In your sponsor letter from the registrar there will be a sample letter that you can use to collect agape letters. Please remember that letters from close friends and family are more meaningful than an excess of letters from acquaintances.

Contact your pilgrim a few days before the walk. Make sure that they have packed everything that they need. Arrange the time that you will be collecting them from their home on Thursday. Remind them about any outstanding fees that are payable at Registration for the walk. Make sure that the applicant is ready. If there is a cancellation due to any circumstances the applicant is responsible for the fees if the registrar has not been informed timeously. Provide transport to the Walk location on Thursday afternoon. When you collect your pilgrim, carry their luggage and pack it into the car for them. Please make sure that you arrive at the site between 7:00 and 7:30. Stay for Sponsors Hour, it should finish not later than 9:15. It is a good time to hand in your agape letters. Letterboxes will be provided in the chapel where Sponsors Hour is being held.

Pray for your pilgrim during the weekend. It is a good idea to also include your name on the 72-hour prayer vigil. These are usually distributed for the community to complete at the gathering prior to the walk.

Check on your pilgrims family or important friends. This can be done by telephone calls or a visit on Friday evening or Saturday morning. If you are going to see them on Sunday morning at church make a special effort to spend some time with them before or after the service.

Attend Candlelight on Saturday evening, You are free to arrive between 7:45 and 8:00. Please bring your service book, and any outstanding agape letters. Attend Walk Closing and provide

transport for your pilgrim back home. Help them in collecting their stuff from their room.

Make sure that your pilgrim gets involved in a Reunion Group. A list should be included in their Fourth Day packets (Next Steps packets for Chrysalis members).

Take your pilgrim to the next Community Gathering. The gathering details will be included in the Fourth Day packets and will be on your sponsor information letter.
