

Offer Yourself

Romans 12:1-21

*How we should act with God, with believers,
and with those who do not yet believe.*

DOING YOUR PART

Rebuilding the walls of Jerusalem was an enormous project. Most Jews understood the importance and gave time and energy to the project. This included the people of Tekoa, a town located about 10 miles south of Jerusalem, who were assigned to help build the Fish Gate. But for some reason, their nobles would not do their part.

Perhaps they felt this was work for common people, or they had better things to do. Perhaps they simply were not willing. But through their lack of commitment, they were poor examples and poor leaders. They hindered the work of God through their lack of effort and bad attitudes.

In contrast, as a man appointed by the king, Nehemiah could have enjoyed special status. But he understood the biblical principle that everyone has a role to play in God's Kingdom. Everyone needs to contribute.

Paul reminded the Corinthians that we all are part of the body of Christ. While the body is one, there are "many members." Each of us has a unique role. We have been given unique gifts and responsibilities. But we all need each other, and the contribution of every person is important (1 Corinthians 12:12-26).

Remember that God has special assignments just for you. You are important to Him and the body of Christ. Dedicate your life to serving Him, to fulfilling His calling. Offer your life as a "living sacrifice" (Romans 12:1). Focus on doing your part.

Prayer

Father, thank You for Your call on my life. I dedicate my life to You. Use me to impact lives for Your Kingdom. In Jesus' name, amen.

The word agape was used by early Christians to refer to the self-sacrificing love of God for humanity and the reciprocating love toward God and among one another. In simple terms, agape means love, as in the love of God. In the Emmaus Movement, agape acts are special acts of prayer, sacrifice and expressions of Christian love on behalf of a Pilgrim by another Christian.



Sponsorship of another pilgrim is the ultimate act of agape since by prayerfully seeking God's guidance and through self-sacrifice, you are able to bless another individual with the experience of three days in His presence. Agape letters from other communities and the 72 hour prayer vigil are introduced on Friday afternoon and illustrate God's love for everyone through community prayer and sacrifice. On Saturday, the pilgrims become increasingly aware of table agape which is the same for everyone but shows up as a gift for each person, reflecting the fact that God loves us all the same but cares for each of us individually. On Sunday afternoon, the personal agape letters from family and friends communicate God's love for each pilgrim in personal ways that are unique through relationships.

You are encouraged to participate fully in the 72 hour prayer vigil. You and your Reunion Groups are encouraged to make or purchase gifts of agape for our walks. You just have to have a loving spirit and a desire to express Christian love. There is no limit to the type or amount of gifts you can make and it can be anything that pertains to God's love, the healing grace He offers us, how to be His servants, etc.

There are no minimums nor special labeling requirements for agape. If you would like to make Agape for the entire conference room team and all of the pilgrims, 80 items are required for each walk. When making individual table agape, you may want to attach a label with a particular scripture or simple phrase associated with your gift. These gifts are to actually represent God's love and therefore we should remain as anonymous servants. Mark your package of items to indicate if they are for the Men's Walk or Women's Walk, especially if they are brought at the same time. The Upper Room, part of United Methodist Discipleship Ministries, began the three-day ecumenical spiritual-renewal retreats in 1978. The self-supporting ministry grew out of the Catholic Cursillo movement, and took the name Walk to Emmaus in 1981. The goal of Walk to Emmaus is to equip church members for Christian action. Following the three-day experience, participants are joined in small groups to support each other in their ongoing walk with Christ. The movement also includes the [Chrysalis](#) program for youth, the [Face to Face](#) program for adults 60 and older, and the [Journey to the Table](#) program for adults 18 to 35.




My family were not huggers. I was loved, yes. But we talked and did things which stimulated our curiosity rather than our emotions. Speaking from my heart is hard.
