### THE KEY TO SUCCESSFUL GROUP REUNIONS

A Fourth-Day perspective on The Walk to Emmaus prevails in communities with successful group reunions. These communities measure

the vitality of the Emmaus movement not by the number of Walks or the number of pilgrims but by the number of ongoing group reunions among the pilgrims. Community members understand that the goal of Emmaus is not just a great Three-day experience but a revitalized and sustained spiritual relationship with Christ and the church during our Fourth Day as disciples of Jesus Christ in the world. Commitment to this understanding is evident in the community's leadership, teams, and sponsors.

Fourth Day is a priority among the Emmaus Community leadership. Though everyone agrees in theory that group reunions are important, the leaders of the Emmaus community practice this method of living in grace. While every Board of Directors hopes that pilgrims will group, each discusses and acts on this hope in concrete and creative ways. After and Emmaus weekend, the board discusses continuing responsibility pilgrims who have just completed and Emmaus weekend and monitors the effort to involve the pilgrims in groups.

#### A COLD DAY IN PHILLY

This story is true. It happened January 26th, 2012 in Philadelphia, PA. I am submitting this story anonymously – because it is not important what I did, but it is important what God did...The lessons learned in this story are so profound, so true, and so revealing about how God works in our lives – I just felt compelled. Sort of like the afternoon of January 26th, 2012...

A couple of years ago I read Under the Overpass by Mike Yankoski. Mike tells the story about his intentional journey into the world of the homeless. Mike and his friend spend 5 months on the street - homeless. The book broke down so many preconceived notions I held about the homeless. The two most important things I learned from the book were: 1) More than food, more than shelter, more than anything, the homeless need affirmation they are valuable human beings. 2) The number of times during the 5 month period Mike and his friend were helped by somebody who professed to be a Christian -One!!! So with that in mind, I have made it my personal ministry to try and help at least one person a week while traveling for business. It is uncanny how God always seem to lead me to the one person who needs it the most. In cities of literally hundreds of homeless people, I always seem to find the One. In cities like Philadelphia, Houston, San Francisco, there is no shortage of homeless. They are everywhere. And it is impossible to help them all...But God knows that – he just really wants me to be open to helping the One.

I was returning from the office late in the afternoon. The walk from the office to the hotel is about 15 minutes. I always try to walk the same route partly for safety and partly because it is the most direct route. This particular afternoon it was cold and drizzling rain. As I approached the intersection where I make one of many zigzags, the lights were not set properly for me to safely cross. So, instead, I continued straight ahead proceeded down a street I have rarely traveled. And it didn't take long to see something I have never seen before a young man sitting in the middle of the sidewalk, with his bare feet suspended over a steam grate. He was trying to warm his feet in the steam, in the middle of the sidewalk, in 35 degree weather. I was watching him and watching the people as they passed. Nobody even acknowledged his existence. It was like he was invisible. And it was disturbing. My first thought was, "He really doesn't have any shoes – he needs shoes." But I kept walking – along with the rest of the city - as though this was not a concern of mine. It wasn't 10 seconds after walking by the young man that the thought hit me, "What am I doing? Here is somebody with a real need and I just walked by like he doesn't exist." I then begin to rationalize. I look around thinking there are probably no places to buy shoes anyway...I look up and down both sides of the street looking for a store that sells shoes. I'm thinking, if I see a store that sells shoes in the next minute or so, I am going to return and buy the young man some shoes...So what do I see - of course, I see on the opposite side of the street three businesses that sell shoes - one being Foot Locker. I turn around and start walking back toward the young man. I make eve contact as I approach him. He is still sitting there holding his frozen feet in the steam. Before I speak I examine his feet. It is quickly obvious this is not some attempt to scam somebody into buying shoes. His feet are blistered and bloody and filthy. He has been without shoes for some time. I asked him, "Where are your shoes?" responded, "I don't know." I said, "What do you mean you don't know?"

He tells me, "I woke up yesterday and my shoes and socks were gone." I told him to come with me. He asked me, "Am I in trouble?"

It was painful to watch the young man walk. I can only imagine how much it must have hurt him to walk on the cold, wet streets. We walked very slowly – he stayed a few paces behind me. I could tell he wasn't really sure what was about to happen. We get to the entrance of Foot Locker and I open the door and turn around and he is just staring at me - not saying a word. I said, "Come inside. I am going to buy vou some shoes." We entered the store and a clerk comes over and asked if we needed help. I tell the clerk, pointing at the young man, "He needs some shoes." The clerk looked down at his cold and bloodied feet, then looked back at me and said, "I guess he does". "What size?" the clerk asked. "13", the young man responded. I thought great, I would have to get the homeless guy with a size 13 foot! The clerk headed to a backroom looking for a size 13 in the style we picked. I asked the young man his name. "Josh", he said. He is really not looking at me and he seemed a bit confused by the whole episode. I asked him where he is from. He responded by giving me the intersection of the two well-known streets a couple of blocks from where we were. He really seemed uncomfortable by the whole thing. It was almost like he was waiting - and you will have to excuse me - for the other shoe to drop. The clerk reappears with a box of New Balance shoes. I tell the clerk to get him a 6pack of socks as well. The clerk handed him the socks and shoes and Josh proceed to put on the socks then the shoes. "Do they fit?" the clerk asked. Josh responded with a nod. We headed to the register to pay. I could feel Josh standing behind me, waiting for an explanation of what just happened. The clerk rang up the bill -\$72. I gave the clerk my credit card and handed the sack, with the socks and the empty shoe box, to Josh. I kept the receipt. Josh was still just looking at me. I told Josh, "You know, I don't even know vou but I care enough about you to buy you shoes. So go take care of yourself...And before the day is over I want you to

help somebody in need." He nodded and turned and walked toward the door, exiting out of the store, into the cold, rainy streets of Philadelphia.

So do I believe God placed that young man in front of me that day? I do. Do I believe God set circumstances in motion for me to buy that young man shoes? I do. It happens to all of us, all of the time. Once we let God know we are willing to help, He will prepare for us the circumstances to fill a need. Having said all of that, we do have a choice. And if we choose to allow God to make ourselves available, then He will take care of the details. As we learned on our Walk, "Discipleship" and "Christian Action" really do mean something. They give us the opportunity to truly make a difference in somebody's life. I feel certain I could have talked to that young man all day and nothing was going to make more of an impact, nothing was going to mean very much, until that young man's feet were covered and warm. It is so easy to ignore people in need and it is so easy to avoid uncomfortable situations. But that is not what God has called us to do. Just remember, we really are the hands and feet of Christ - or in this case, the shoes...
