What an Exciting Time!!





A couple years ago I was out of State traveling with my sister. I was driving and a car passed us. They were in a hurry. It wasn't long before a squirrel attempted to cross the road and was hit by the car that passed us.

Immediately my sister pleads, "Stop! Stop! Stop! Stop the car!" I'm sure the look on my face was horrific. Seriously, we are going to stop for a squirrel!? This happens all the time. Why are we stopping and what can we possibly do about it? Those were just a few of my thoughts.

So, I stop and turn around. I drive her back to the scene with the squirrel lying in the

middle of the road.
Now I am parked on
the shoulder with my
flashers on, in the
middle of nowhere,
and she is in the
middle of the road with
the squirrel.

I'm watching all of this in my rear-view mirror, thoughts running through my head as she tends to this squirrel. You have to know my sister. I am compassionate. She is overly compassion on steroids. This is the only reason I stopped the car.

She is now walking toward the car with this squirrel in her hands. She opens the door and all I can say is, "That squirrel is NOT GETTING IN THIS CAR!" I say this as adamantly as she had pleaded for me to stop the car.

We are in the middle of nowhere with no place open on Sunday to take this squirrel. And we are...

...OUT OF TOWN; IN ANOTHER STATE. She retreats with the squirrel.

I am thinking and probably saying aloud, "Please die squirrel. Oh, please Lord, let this squirrel die." She uses her cell service to see if there are any alternatives. Finding none, she places the squirrel off the road, in the shade.

As she makes her way back to the car, crying, she says we need to flag someone down and ask if they have a gun to shoot the squirrel so it will not continue to suffer. It occurs to me that I have a handgun in the glove box. I'm licensed. But I'm not sure I can shoot the squirrel. She says she cannot. I realize we are not leaving this squirrel until it is taken care of.

I have watched all this in my rear-view mirror, from the comfort of the driver's seat, having never left the car. As we sit there, contemplating our next move, I see someone in the rear-view mirror walking down the road... (continued on next page)

toward us, and I say to my sister, "Maybe this guy coming down the road can shoot the squirrel." She says, "What guy?"

She gets out of the car holding the handgun wrapped in a towel. Now I leave the car. As I follow her, she begins telling this young man, who looks 12 to me. the story of the squirrel. She asks if he will shoot it so it won't suffer. As she begins to hand the gun over to him, I take it and ask him how old he is. I'm wondering if he will shoot us and not the squirrel. But I also don't want to put a gun in the hand of a minor. He responds, "I'll be 20 soon." I realize if she cannot shoot the squirrel, and he won't shoot the squirrel, I am going to have to shoot the squirrel so we can get out of here.

I'm holding the gun.
She takes the young
man to the squirrel. He
immediately begins
checking its spine with
two fingers like he

knows what he's doing. He says, "I think the squirrel can make it. I'll take it home with me."

Wait!! What? What just happened? Manna!! What is it? Have we found, in the middle of nowhere, someone as compassionate as my sister?

And where did he come from? We had passed no one walking on the road only a moment before. We thank him profusely and watch him turn and begin his walk in the direction he came from.

And it occurs to me...The disciples had chosen to walk by sight; but Jesus, walking by faith, saw what they had missed—He saw the makings of a miracle.

The disciples were able to produce "only five loaves and two fish," which a young "lad" in the crowd had brought with him. However, the word

only is not in Jesus's vocabulary.

I had "only" wanted the squirrel to die. Jesus sees what I missed. He uses this miracle to remind me. I must think bigger. I must walk by faith first.

We will never partner with Jesus in a miracle if we see only what is in our hands. We must set our gaze on heaven's power and remind ourselves that there is a God who does, indeed, intervene in the affairs of human beings. There is a God who is more than enough in any of our life situations. There is a God and He is able!

The Emmaus talks heard on Sunday at our walk prepare us for returning to the world from the protected and cloistered environment of Emmaus. The talk on fourth day sets us up for a lifetime of commitment and service. Commit to yourself to explore the fourth day reunion groups near you. Remember that Reunion groups are a way of preserving your walk with Christ. Keep the following points in mind:

Be Serious – You are dealing with things eternal. There is always time for levity but the focus should be on the condition of your walk with Christ.

Be Discreet – Openness and honesty must be respected. The discussions of the group stays in the group. Your reunion group must not be a source of gossip.

Be Sincere – You must be completely open and honest with your group. If that is not possible, you may be in the wrong group.

Be Regular – This can be tough but regular at-tendance will develop into a habit that can become a major influence facing problems and staying on course. Again, it requires perseverance to grow and find nourishment.

- Begin your time together by calling on the Holy Spirit and invoking His power.
- Review your service sheet Take time to reflect on each of the three supports of a life in grace.
- Piety Share your closet moment with Christ and how He is working in your life.
- Study Keep each other accountable in growth by learning more about this life in grace and His abundant love.
- Action How have we responded to God's call to action and submitted to being an instrument for Him to someone else?
- Closest to Christ At what moment this past week did you feel closest to Christ?
- Call to Discipleship At what moment during this week did you feel you were responding to God's call to be His disciple? Where did you participate in being the Church this week, the heartbeat of Christ?
- Discipleship Denied When was your faith tested this week through failure?
- Your Plan What is your plan for spirituality, study and action for the week to come?
- Reunion Group Activities.
- Close with a Prayer of Thanksgiving.
