A Word From Community Lay Director

Walks 92 and 93, “The best Walks ever”, are now complete and the Greater Rose Area Community of Emmaus has 38 new Babe Chicks who have bonded together in the Holy Spirit, through tears, laughter, prayer, and sharing this walk experience together. This would not have been possible without all of the members of the GRACE community that exhibited agape love in prayer, made agape, sponsored pilgrims, and all of the efforts not captured here. We wish to thank each of you in the G.R.A.C.E. community for the mighty acts that were accomplished through the body of Christ!

Many of you have devoted 72 hours of your own time to serve as Christ’s hands and feet by serving on the teams. Thank you to all who participated through prayer or your presence. It is because of your efforts that our Spring Walks were “the best walks ever”.

Walk 93 met a new host of new challenges to say the least, with the pandemic COVID19 coronavirus! For the first time in our history, to my knowledge, the community would not be allowed to participate in candlelight or closing. No one other than those already at the camp were allowed into the camp at the direction of Disciples Crossing Medical Director. But our creator made a path for the walk to go on! The Teams for this walk had to compensate for the inability of the community to participate, and the usual outside team members that come in on Saturday and Sunday to assist. Thank you to this combined team that worked as one in the body of Christ, and tirelessly under new circumstances to make this walk successful.

With the COVID19 Coronavirus pandemic we are operating in a new environment. The Upper Room – Walk to Emmaus Board stated in their edicts that we will not have reunion group meetings, gatherings, etc. for the next several weeks. Our GRACE Board met and decided that we adhere to the guidelines, and we will not have gatherings or reunion groups meet for the next 30-days and will reevaluate to determine the steps necessary going forward. We will try our best to keep the community informed.

Our Fall Walks are right around the corner and will need to begin this process again to be prepared for these walks. Please be in prayer for Women’s Walk 94 and Men’s Walk 95. Also, please consider sponsoring a pilgrim for one or both of these walks. The pilgrim and team applications are both available on our community website. Our Babe Chick meeting is scheduled for April 18th at 4p.m. at First UMC Lindale has been postponed to a later date that will be announced when these meetings are again possible. The sponsors training and gathering scheduled for the same date is also being postponed.

We are always in need of agape gifts. If you are making these for the pilgrims only, please make 36. If you are making them for the entire team, please make 72.

Our Fall Lay Directors are Laura Resler and Steve Morton, and we ask that you keep them in your prayers as they begin planning the next “best walks ever!”

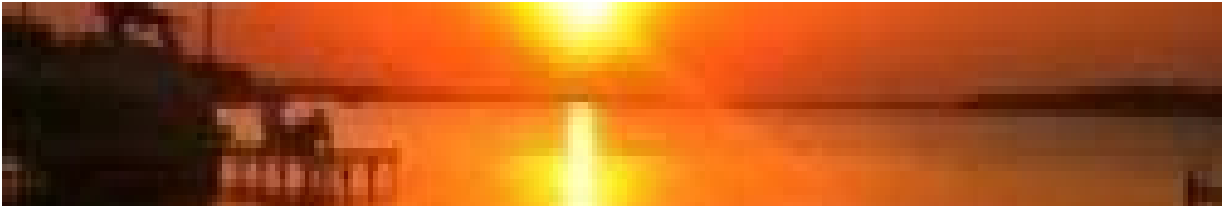

The Walk to Emmaus is a spiritual renewal program intended to strengthen the local church through the development of Christian disciples and leaders. It is not for everyone. It is not for the first time Christians.

You may ask who will benefit from this walk. Quite simply it is your friends, your neighbors, fellow church members and the clergy. It is for Christians of every denomination. Every 4th dayer can be a sponsor.

Please be in prayerful consideration of what this walk meant to you and what it will mean to someone else in our community of faith.

When you are ready to sponsor your pilgrim. Remember to pray with them. Work with them to fill out the pilgrim application which requires 3 signatures; theirs, their pastor and the sponsor. The cost of the walk is \$165. A \$50 dollar deposit must be sent in with the application. All pilgrim applications should be sent to :

The Walk To Emmaus Movement



Walk to Emmaus THE UPPER ROOM.®

The Upper Room, part of United Methodist Discipleship Ministries, began the three-day ecumenical spiritual-renewal retreats in 1978. The self-supporting ministry grew out of the the Catholic Cursillo movement, and took the name Walk to Emmaus in 1981. The goal of Walk to Emmaus is to equip church members for Christian action. Following the three-day experience, participants are joined in small groups to support each other in their ongoing walk with Christ. The movement also includes the [Chrysalis](#) program for youth, the [Face to Face](#) program for adults 60 and older, and the [Journey to the Table](#) program for adults 18 to 35.



I wanted to share what the gathering did for my church and how it has inspired my congregation. The folks that attended the February gathering at our church, McCary's Chapel, saw a glimpse of the love our members have for one another and the willingness to meet new people. Our congregation was so overwhelmed by the experience that over a 1/3 of my congregation is attending the Oct. walk. We will have 6 women and 3 men going, in a church that has about 26-28 attending on Sundays. This is a testament of what God does when we all pull together and feel his love, grace and presence amongst us. I wonder, if maybe we had a mini new introductory gathering on a Wednesday night maybe once a quarter in 4 key churches throughout our community geared towards younger families that could come and participate. Most kids have church activities on Wednesday night so we just incorporate our service with them in mind. You can see our Emmaus landscape, we need younger families to get involved, we just need to keep the kids weekend activities in mind for greater attendance. 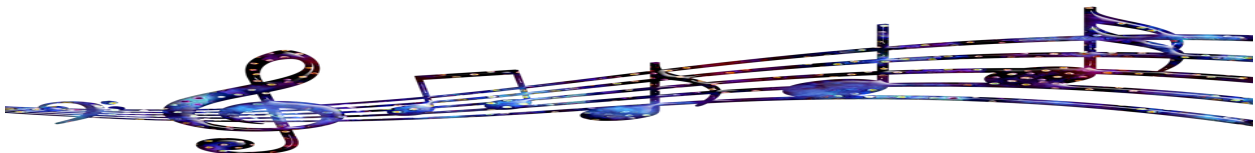
The Spiritual Team was able to provide the spiritual guidance for all of us even though the conditions made it much more difficult.

G.R.A.C.E. Emmaus Walk #93

I served as a Table Leader, during this Walk, and was excited and honored to be asked to serve, in this way. I did not know how blessed I would be, while serving on this Walk. As always, we arrived on Thursday, and there was some mild distraction related to COVID 19, but it was not a real concern, to most of us. Later, the camp's administration required that we be screened, to alleviate their concerns, though, they really wanted us to cancel the event. The team was screened, and each person coming into camp was screened. Then, we got down to business, doing God's work. Thursday evening and Friday morning followed the normal flow as we began to get to know our pilgrims, and to see how each table would function. All the ladies were amazing and had beautiful stories to share. Around midday, on Friday, the Camp Director decided no one would be allowed to enter the camp. This meant that one of the ASDs would not be present, and that the men would not be able to serve Christ's Dinner, and that the Community would not be present for Candlelight. Though it was hard to give up control, we needed to let go, and let God take control. Meanwhile, the walk continued, and the ladies were really getting the message, and moving forward with the program, and many great discussions followed the talks.

The Service Team and the Chapel Teams came together, and miracles began to happen. A Virtual Prayer Vigil was set up by one of the Community members who was aware of the changes. This became a worldwide vigil; reading the posts later was truly inspiring and showed the power of the Holy Spirit. God's amazing grace was seen over the next several hours as the Service and Chapel teams served Christ's Dinner, then flipped the dining hall, and created a glimpse of heaven, using props from the camp. The pilgrims were sung into candlelight. When the candles were raised to the pilgrims as they sang "Jesus, Jesus," the pilgrims raised their arms and reached out to the Service Team. God was moving through the hall, and we all felt his love.

Sunday proceeded along, though, we knew that the only people present for closing would be the pilgrims and the Walk Team. The pilgrims shared freely, and with Grace. Pilgrim pickup looked like an elementary school pickup. Cars were allowed in, the drivers were to remain in the car, and we carried everything to the car, with the appropriate pilgrim(s).

I know that on this Walk I saw God moving in so many ways, to make things happen with grace and beauty. I will be forever grateful that I had the experience of serving, with this team, at this time. In many ways, I felt that I was reliving my own Walk, in a different and special way.
