
Community Lay Director's Corner

Although the Walk to Emmaus is a unique and powerful instrument through which faithful people are renewed and inspired, it cannot provide the well-rounded programs that an individual congregation offers, such as education, evangelism, missions and stewardships. In short, Emmaus does not intend to become anyone's "new church." However, Emmaus does have a unique role in the church's task of nurturing strong committed disciples who compassionately serve Christ in the world. The unique role of The Walk to Emmaus is spiritual renewal.


Meaning of Grace



Faith, Faithfulness, and Faithful

1st Corinthians 4:2 says, "Moreover it is required in stewards that one be found faithful."

Let's break this down. Who are the stewards? God's people. What do they do? Manage the resources of the Owner. Who is the Owner? God. What is the requirement? To be faithful to God.

So, what is the definition of faithfulness? According to Google, "Faithfulness is the act of being true to your word or promise. It's the ability to follow through on commitments with dedication." In my humble opinion using this secular definition of "faithful," with just one caveat, 100% of everyone of us is faithful. So, what is the caveat? Each person gets to IDENTIFY THE SPECIFIC AREA OF THEIR LIFE WHERE THEIR FAITHFULNESS IS BEING EVALUATED.

THE REALITY IS WE ARE ALL FAITHFUL TO OUR PRIORITIES IN LIFE. Here are some of the things we may be faithful to: our spouse, children, family, friends, job or business, fishing, hunting, sports, drugs, working out at the gym, creating drama, TV, alcohol, hate, gossip, money, shopping, porn, social media, crime, video games. The list goes on.

Let's look at the Kingdom definition of faith and faithfulness. It's defined in 2 parts. **FAITH** - the belief, assurance and trustworthiness of God's Word, His promises and all He has done.

FAITHFULNESS - is living in consistent and dedicated accord with that truth. So to me, FAITHFULNESS comes down to the question of OBEDIENCE (GOD'S SPIRIT versus our FLESH). Faithfulness is proving our loyalty to

God through unwavering obedience. Being faithful isn't just about proclaiming our loyalty to God. True faithfulness is proven by our actions.

I don't know about you, but for me, it's helpful to keep some key principles in mind that give me the right perspective. Let me share 4 principles for you to think about in the journey of being faithful.

#1 LOYALTY TO GOD. He is our CREATOR. We are made in His image. He is our MASTER. We are His children. We are His servants. Deuteronomy 6:5 says, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and all your soul and with all your strength."

#2 ADHERE TO GOD'S WORD. God wants us to know the truth, who He is, and His nature through the Bible and Scripture. James 1:22 tells us "Be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves." It takes more than reading the Word and knowing the Word, it requires doing the Word.

#3 BE CONSTANT AND UNWAVERING IN FAITH. God's Word tells us we will have challenges, pain, suffering, and persecution in our lives. We are in spiritual warfare every day. Satan is constantly on the warpath. God's Spirit vs our flesh and the world's view. James 1:6 tells us, "You must believe and not doubt, because the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea, blown and tossed by the wind." No matter the challenges, falls, stumbles, or setbacks we need to keep the faith.

#4 BE A CONSISTENT SOWER. When we emulate Christlike qualities and sow seeds of truth and love in others' lives, God feeds our spirit, changes our heart, enlarges our spiritual understanding and desire to live for Him and grow His kingdom. Galatians 6:9 tells us, "Let us not become weary in doing good"

for at the proper time, we will reap a harvest if we do not give up."

We all know the journey of becoming and being faithful to God is a long and difficult road. But we know God is always with us!

When Christ Returns

During our life, most of us will have opportunities to experience amazing things, see beautiful views, and hear wonderful music. But more marvelous than any earthly event is what Christians will experience at the return of Christ. Just imagine...

- What we will hear. Jesus "will descend from heaven with a shout" (1 Thess. 4:16). The voice of the archangel Michael the leader of the angelic host and a heavenly trumpet will be heard, calling the saints to assemble.
- What we will see. The Lord will come down from above, to be met in the air by newly resurrected saints and then, a moment later, by living believers. Paul explains in Scripture what will happen at Christ's return both to the saints who have died and to those still living. First, Jesus will descend from the sky in a way similar to His ascension. (See Acts 1:11.) Then, God will resurrect the bodies of departed believers. (We know from 2 Corinthians 5:8 that their spirits will have been with Jesus since the moment of physical death.) Next, Christians who are still alive will rise to meet Jesus in the air and will dwell with Him forever.

• What we will feel. Though it's impossible to know exactly what the experience will be like, we can expect it to be magnificent. We'll be transformed physically: Unlike our present body, our new form won't be susceptible to pain, sin, sadness, sickness, or death. And in an instant, we will be brought into the presence of our heavenly Father, to remain with Him for eternity.

Let's encourage one another - and ourselves - with this reminder about Jesus Christ's return (1 Thess. 4:18). So, when hardships get you down, think about this exciting event in your future. The best is yet to come!

Walking in Grace


When anxiety was great within me, your consolation brought me joy.
