

Would you like to work on a Walk? Are you wondering what you might want to do?

For those new to the GRACE Community, I will tell you that we have ONE lay member team on each Walk, subdivided into four parts: Conference Room Team, Music Team (which is in the conference room), Chapel Team, and Outside Team. The Chapel and Outside parts of the team are also known as the Servant Team.

We also have a Spiritual Team, made up of a Spiritual Director and four Assistant Spiritual Directors, who are pastors in our community. They are also part of the Conference Room Team.

Though I have served on every lay member team except Music, I can tell you that the most fulfilling for me has been the "Servant Team".

The Servant Team is especially good for someone who is new to working on the Walk, even if they have already worked on the Conference Room Team. Many of those working on either the Chapel Team or the Outside Team have much experience with the Walk to Emmaus. On most Walks, there will be a handful of past Lay Directors and others who have worked on many Servant Teams. They can help you learn a lot about the things that are done on a Walk, and why they are done that way. Also, both genders can work on the Outside Team for any Walk, Men's or Women's.

The first time you work on a Servant Team, you quickly learn that things don't just magically happen during the course of the three days. The Chapel and Outside Teams are working continuously to ensure that everything is ready for the Pilgrims and the Conference Room Team at just the right time! Plus, you will have a lot of good, Christian fellowship while you are working in the background.

The Spring Walks will be sneaking up on us very quickly, and the Team Selection Committee will be meeting immediately before the Gathering on November 11 to determine who will be asked to fill each position.



Road to Emmaus

Artist Michael Torevell states that his desire in *Road to Emmaus* was to paint a setting that leaves the viewer with a sense of surprise and wonder — a setting where the viewer can enter the story and catch a glimpse of the diving nature of God. His use of a stylized landscape that incorporates many details but little specificity invites us into the narrative. Buildings that resemble modern-day structures also recall ancient villages. Three crosses on a hill capture our attention and anchor us to the Crucifixion story.

As we know, the Emmaus Road story is based on Luke 24:15-27, and the three on the road are Jesus, Cleopas and another traveler. As Torevell depicts it, the road could be anywhere, and the blurred faces of the travelers could be anyone.

An Emmaus experience can occur along any "road" that we travel in life – during times of grief, the Lenten journey, or even in ordinary times. Like Cleopas, we might encounter the risen Christ where and when we least expect it. Will we recognize Jesus? Perhaps others traveling the road will see Christ within us as we share the joyful news of our risen Savior.


Feeding on God's Faithfulness
