A Five Point Test for Walk Teams and Boards:

- 1. Will it glorify God?
- 2. Will it move the Pilgrims closer to God?
- 3. Is it going to glorify someone on the team or in the community?
- 4. Will it detract the Pilgrim from receiving the intended message?
- 5. Does it fit the message of the day and the flow of the weekend?

Finally - To Embody Christ means:

"If you have gotten anything at all out of following Christ, if his love has made any difference in your life, if being in a community of the spirit means anything to you, if you have a heart, if you care - then do me a favor:"

Agree with each other... Love each other... Be deep-spirited friends... Don't push your way to the front... Don't sweet talk your way to the top... Put yourself aside and help others get ahead... Don't be obsessed with getting your own advantage...

Forget yourselves long enough to lend a helping hand...

Think of yourself the way Christ Jesus thought of Himself...

With a leap he stood upright and began to walk; and he entered the temple with them, walking and praising God.

If we don't know and believe God's promises and capabilities, we will ask for too little, when God is willing to give us much more they we ever dared or imagined.

Are you willing to settle for crumbs when He wants you to have a full banquet? Have you accepted defeat over your problems, sickness, habits addictions when He wants to give you victory? Have you accepted a life of misery when He wants to give you a life of abundance? Are you settling for getting by when He wants to give you everything? Are you acting like a lame beggar instead of a Child of the King? Are you asking for alms when he wants to make you walk?

Matthew 5:16 ... let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven. As a little girl, the scriptures that made the greatest impression on me were the ones like this one. The ones that did not necessarily say go out and preach on street corners, or even behind a pulpit, but the ones that said to live your life as an example of Christ in everything you do. We all perceive the world through our own personality and our own experiences. Being a terribly shy child, I appreciated that I would not have to preach to show Christ to the world. Perhaps you are of the same mind. We are not all called to preach after all. However, something happened this week that caused me to question my "work quietly in the background" attitude. On Monday October 24th my brother turned a front end loader over in a pond. Thankfully, the tractor did not end up in the water, only deep mud, and the loader was equipped with a reinforced cab that protected him from serious injury. He was, however, very shaken up, and of course everyone who heard about the accident had a story to tell about someone they knew who might or might not have survived a similar accident. He and we know that he could have been gone in an instant. We all live with the knowledge that life in this world is short, but, as Christians, we also live with the knowledge that this is not all there is. Most of us know someone who does not know the love, peace, and joy of knowing Jesus Christ. And while it is important to live every day in every way as the "salt of the earth and the light of the world" by our actions, sometimes it is necessary to step out of our personality, step out of our comfort zone, and share the word of God in a more direct way. This week God sent me a very real and concrete example of why I need to share his love with those around me in a real and direct way. I am thankful for the reminder, and the push. Perhaps my reminder can be yours as well.

Sunday October 30 was a very difficult day to face as the first Sunday Lanes Chapel would be without their beloved Bro Lou. The place was full of tears and joy. It was "Pastor Appreciation Sunday" at Lanes Chapel; so last week Bro Lou had picked out his favorite songs to be sung and had asked the Children's Choir to sing as well. As one of our members stated, "Little did Bro Lou know that it would be his sweet goodbye kiss to his congregation". At the end of the service a young man accepted Christ into his heart. Any of you who know Bro Lou and have

attended one of the Lanes Chapel services know that when someone accepts Jesus into their heart... Brother Lou would jump for joy. Bro Lou would say if you can jump up and down at a football game you should be able to jump up and down when someone comes into the family of the Lord. Well after our new Christian and member of the church was introduced. Brenda Thomas (wife) and (Brother-in-Richard Hughes law) came forward and asked us all to jump on the count of three as Bro Lou would have done. It was AWESOME!!
