Yes, a flashlight. Not an expensive gift, but one that kept the girls and me busy, shining the beam of the flashlight so that the dark was no longer dark. They quickly embraced the power of the flashlight to shine light, and they were even more excited to know that they could use light to get rid of the darkness. Like many young children, Alyssa was sometimes afraid of the dark. She wanted a night light on in her room so she was happy to know that with the flashlight she would always have light with her. Fear of the dark was no longer a problem. The dark was now more of an adventure with her flashlight.

Jesus left us with the "light of the Holy Spirit." We, with the same excitement and happiness, are to use the light of the Holy Spirit just as Alyssa used her flashlight to banish darkness and to shine light in the lives of people we meet and especially in the lives of the pilgrims that we sponsor, love and serve on their Walk to Emmaus.

Christ is counting on us to shine the light of the Holy Spirit as that same Holy Spirit calls and uses us so that lives can be changed. We have the responsibility to carry on the work of making disciples through the Grace Emmaus community. That same light infuses our lives and empowers us to listen, to show up, and to be obedient to God's call on our life to serve our neighbor.


#### **Prayer and Service for Our Walks**


We all have a "donkey" that can be used by God. What do you give? The guy who gave Jesus the donkey is just one of many nameless folks who gave little things for our big God to use.

## What is the meaning behind the name "Walk to Emmaus"?

The Walk to Emmaus gets its name from the story in Luke 24:13-35, which provides the central image for the three-day experience and follow-up. Luke tells the story of that first Easter afternoon when the risen Christ appeared to the two disciples who were walking together along the road from Jerusalem to Emmaus. Like Christians and churches who are blinded by preoccupation with their own immediate difficulties, these two disciples' sadness and hopelessness seemed to prevent them from seeing God's redemptive purpose in things that had happened.

And yet, the risen Christ "came near and went with them," opening the disciples' eyes to His presence and lighting the fire of God's love in their hearts. As they walked to Emmaus, Jesus explained to them the meaning of all the scriptures concerning Himself. When they arrived in Emmaus, Jesus "took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them," and their eyes were opened. They recognized Him as Jesus, the risen Lord, and they remembered how their hearts had burned within them as they talked with Him on the road. Within the hour, the two disciples left Emmaus and returned immediately to their friends in Jerusalem. As they told stories about their encounters with the risen Lord, Jesus visited them again with a fresh awareness of his living presence.



However, the story of Jesus' resurrection does not conclude with the disciples' personal spiritual experiences. Jesus ascended to the Father, and the disciples became the body of the risen Christ through the empowerment of the Holy Spirit. The disciples were sent forth by the Spirit to bear witness to the good news of God in Jesus Christ. They learned to walk in the spirit of Jesus, to proclaim the gospel to a disbelieving world, and to persevere in grace through spiritual companionship with one another.

The Walk to Emmaus offers today's disciples a parallel opportunity to rediscover Christ's presence in their lives, to gain fresh understanding of God's transforming grace, and to form friendships that foster faith and support spiritual maturity. While Emmaus provides a pathway to the mountaintop of God's love, it also supports pilgrims' return to the world in the power of the Spirit to share the love they have received with a hurtful and hurting world.

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#### **Indescribable Joy**

At the last Emmaus Board meeting, Pastor Mike talked about indescribable joy.

Joy. Everyone wants it. It might surprise you to know that joy is a big topic in the Bible. God wants his children to be joy-filled. Just like a mother wants her baby to laugh with glee, or a Nana gets a warm fuzzy every time her grand-angel texts her, God longs for us to experience a deep-seated, deeply rooted joy.

The joy offered by God is so much different than the day to day Earthly joy we experience. God isn't interested in putting a temporary smile on our face. He wants to deposit BIG hope in our heart. He has no interest in giving us a shallow happiness that fades in hard times. He offers us true joy: a deep-seated, heart-felt, honest-to-goodness, strong sense of joy that can weather the most difficult storms and never fade. A joy that shines above all.

Peter referred to this joy in the opening words of his epistle.

1 Peter 1:8

Although you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy.

Don't let anything steal your indescribable joy!

Heavenly Father, we desire the joy that comes from Christ. Help us to experience the love of Christ on a deeper level. Make our lives glorious for your honor and praise. In Jesus's name. Amen.
